The Difference


BPO takes whole business processes that are well defined, and transfers them to a region with lower pay-scales.

In contrast, microwork provides discrete units of work to workers located anywhere in the world.



Microwork is Geographically Dispersed


oDesk Contractors in 2012






Microwork Offers Growing Income Potential







Microwork

- •\$311 million market to reach multibillion \$
- Already over a million microworkers
- Average age 21-29 years, over 30% women*

There are limited and highly varying estimates of the global market size for microwork. Estimates range from less than \$10 million to \$4.5 billion when microwork is included as part of impact sourcing (infoDev, 2011; Monitor, 2011).

In order to provide a more realistic perspective this study developed an analysis (Annex II), which appraised the current global market size to be \$311 million, and is reflected in employment of 997,250 microworkers. Impact sourcing is referred to in the Monitor study as the use of business process outsourcing services to employ people at the base of the pyramid, to provide high-quality, information-based services to domestic and international clients. The definition includes microwork, and the study also includes microwork aggregator such as Jana and Samasource for its estimates.



Where are we?



ODESK

- 1. The average number of new Nigerian contractors joining oDesk every week has increased by 41% since the event
- 2. The average number of new Nigerian contractors earning their first job on oDesk each week has increased by 55% since the event
- 3. The average number of new Nigerian companies making their first hire on oDesk has increased by 9% since the event
- 4. The average number of new Nigerian companies actively paying contractors on oDesk has increased by 13% since the event

So again, while the gross numbers are still relatively small, this is exactly the type of result we were hoping to see.

To give you some perspective, in 2008-2009, Bangladesh barely registered on our list of contractor countries.

Today, it's the #3 country in terms of hours worked. We look forward to Nigeria's rapid growth in online work!

Where are we?



- 1. Nigerian freelancer registrations: +45% m/m (Monthly baseline growth rate 5%)
- 2. Nigerian freelancers hired: +28% (Monthly baseline growth rate: 2%)
- 3. Nigerian freelancer earnings: +27% (Monthly baseline growth rate: 14%)

New Registered Nigerian Freelancers: 3,511

New Active Nigerian Freelancers: 2,017

New Registered Nigerian Clients: 87

New Active Clients: 42

Revenue earned by New Nigerian Freelancers: \$121,163 USD

Revenue paid by New Nigerian Clients: \$4,600 USD

From our standpoint, it has been a solid success – in previous initiatives, we've seen a bigger short term bump; however our outlook is definitely longer-term in Nigeria.

In support of this, we have hired 3 mobilizers in Nigeria to continue the education and training process throughout the country.


